

About Nevada Donor Network

- Federally designated, 501(c)(3) not-for-profit Organ Procurement Organization (OPO)
- Coordinates the recovery and allocation of donated organs and tissues for transplantation, education, and medical research
- Educates the public about donation and the importance of registration

Nevada Donor Registry

- Registration authorizes organ and tissue donation, unless specific preferences are noted on web registry
- 1,500,000+ Nevadans are registered 64% of eligible population
- Register at the DMV, at registerme.org or using your iPhone (in the Health app)
- NRS 451.500 Uniform Anatomical Gifts Act details Nevada laws regarding donation





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
Types Of Donation

- Organ donation after brain death
 - Occurs in a hospital
- Organ donation after circulatory death
 - · Occurs in a hospital
- Tissue & ocular donation
 - Can take place up to 24 hours after asystole
 - Occurs in a hospital or in a recovery suite
- Other
 - Living donation, whole body donation


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

Facts About Organ Donation

- Organ donation can only take place in a hospital, and primarily occurs following brain death. Brain death may occur as a result of:
 - Head trauma (car accident, gunshot wound)
 - Intra cranial hemorrhage (aneurysm, head injury, hypertension)
 - Brain tumor
 - Anoxia (drowning, overdose, hanging, heart attack, respiratory disease)

What can you do to affect organ donation?


- Perform all life-saving protocols

- Provide detailed report to hospital of all actions taken




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















The Missing Link

- In order to receive Medicare funding, hospitals are REQUIRED to notify their OPO about all deaths and all patients meeting certain clinical triggers
- Deaths that occur outside of hospitals are NOT REQUIRED to be reported to an organ or tissue procurement organization, and so most are not
- This means that registered donors and families who may find comfort in donation are never given the chance simply because no one is notified of the death

EMS Role in Tissue Donation

- By referring all field deaths to Nevada Donor Network, you ensure the option of donation is preserved for all decedents and their families
- Nevada Donor Network is HIPAA Compliant the Uniform Anatomical Gift Act grants Nevada Donor Network access to donors' medical information to determine donor suitability as well as covers health care providers to legally release that information
- Nevada Donor Network respects the privacy of all donors and their families

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

How Potential Donors Are Referred


- A call is made to Nevada Donor Network's 24-hour referral line within one hour of death or as soon as possible. This can be made by a first responder on scene or a dispatcher.
- Provide decedent's name, date of birth, sex, time of death or last time known alive, circumstances of death, any interventions (CPR, fluids) and county where death occurred, and place of final disposition so NDN can follow with the coroner, medical examiner, or funeral home.



Coroner/Medical Examiner Involvement

- Nevada Donor Network now works with most county sheriff's offices
- NDN will reach out to the county sheriff or ME to confirm NOK notification and positive ID, discuss permissions and any restrictions on recovery they may have due to an investigation
- NDN has partnered with the Washoe County Regional Medical Examiner's Office and they will work with us to make recoveries possible

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Family Dynamics and Donation

- For many families, donation is the only positive experience in a tragic chain of events
- You are not expected to have in-depth conversations about donation with families – Nevada Donor Network has trained staff that can answer any questions they may have
- Nevada Donor Network is responsible for determining if a patient meets donor suitability criteria
